

A Tender and Transformative Hair Experience With The Head Editor



This month, we had the joy of bringing our seniors from SUN DAC Upper Thomson's Ageing Well class for a special haircut and wash experience, made possible through the generosity of our partners at The Head Editor. For many of our seniors with intellectual disabilities, stepping into a modern salon complete with its mirrors, equipment, and unfamiliar sensations was a first in their lives. What began as uncertainty soon unfolded into a morning filled with curiosity, laughter, and heartfelt connection.

In the weeks leading up to the outing, our seniors prepared through classroom reenactments as part of Improv with Me2. During these sessions, our trainers introduced the idea of a salon visit in a familiar environment, guiding seniors through what it might feel like to sit in the chair, lean back for a wash, and communicate simple preferences. These rehearsals helped them understand each step clearly and gave them the confidence to approach the real experience without fear. It was heartening to see how practice slowly turned apprehension into readiness.

From the moment they arrived at the salon, Janice and Quester welcomed everyone with extraordinary warmth and patience. They explained each step gently, demonstrated tools slowly, and adjusted their pace to suit each individual's comfort level. Because of their kindness, seniors who were initially anxious found themselves willing to try. Those who hesitated at the start eventually relaxed into the experience, discovering delight in something new and unfamiliar.

What followed were beautiful moments. Soft giggles during the hair wash. Wide smiles as they saw their fresh cuts in the mirror. Touching exchanges between stylists and clients who quickly built trust. For some, the gentle head massage was the highlight. For others, simply being cared for with dignity and respect made the experience unforgettable.

This visit was also part of Improv with Me2, our signature daily living skills programme designed to build independence, confidence, and real world readiness through experiential learning. The salon outing gave our seniors the chance to practise communication, follow routines, and engage socially in a welcoming community space.


With a skilled team of stylists and a welcoming environment, they specialise in delivering tailored recommendations and refined looks from trims and perms to premium colour treatments.

A Confident Step Into Healthcare for Rainbow Centre's Young Adult Activities Group



This month, Me2 Centre of Inclusive Arts welcomed members from Rainbow Centre's Young Adult Activities! (YAA!) for a transformative healthcare learning journey made possible through our meaningful partnership with IDHealth.

For many young adults with diverse needs, visiting a clinic can feel overwhelming. New environments, unfamiliar equipment, and fast-paced interactions often lead to anxiety that makes it difficult to ask for help. Understanding this, Me2 designed a two-step experience to turn uncertainty into confidence.

The programme began with a series of classroom lessons, where our trainers recreated the entire clinic flow through guided reenactments. Students practised registering at the counter, waiting for their turn, experiencing mock nurse checks, engaging in simple doctor interactions, and understanding how medication collection works.

The final lesson culminated in a learning journey to the clinic, where the YAA! participants put everything into practice. With the IDHealth team welcoming them warmly, students registered at the front desk, waited alongside other patients, interacted with clinic staff, and observed real nurse procedures and medication dispensing.

This partnership is especially apt because both Me2 and IDHealth share a deep commitment to making healthcare more approachable for individuals with intellectual disabilities. By blending Me2's experiential teaching with IDHealth's specially designed visual support aids, we transformed what could have been an overwhelming visit into an empowering milestone.

We are proud of the confidence our students gained through this "practise first, experience later" model, and we look forward to furthering this meaningful collaboration as we continue championing dignity, independence, and real-world readiness for the communities we serve.

Voices Rising: A Public Speaking Journey with APSN



Me2 Centre of Inclusive Arts had the privilege of journeying with two APSN classes through our Public Speaking Programme. What began as a simple introduction to voice, confidence, and expression soon blossomed into a series of uplifting sessions filled with courage, joy, and discovery. With one dedicated instructor in each class, students received the steady guidance and personal support they needed to grow at their own pace.

Across the seven sessions, every lesson invited students to explore a different part of what it means to speak with clarity and intention. From playful warm ups like Word Association and vocal exercises, to practising projection through fun tongue twisters, the classroom often buzzed with laughter and renewed confidence.

Body language also became an important part of their journey. Through imaginative activities such as transforming into objects, creating shapes with their bodies, and mindful movement exercises, students learned how posture, gestures, and presence play a vital role in speaking to an audience. These sessions encouraged teamwork, loosened nerves, and helped everyone discover the joy of expressing themselves physically and vocally.

We are incredibly proud of every student who took part in this programme. Their willingness to try, to grow, and to step out of their comfort zones reminds us why spaces like these matter. With encouragement, clear structure, and a nurturing environment, every young person can find a voice that feels fully their own.

A Culinary Pathway to Independence with Youths from YMCA @ Minds Hub (Bukit Batok)



This season, we had the privilege of bringing our Meal Prep with Me2 programme to the vibrant youths at YMCA, where learning, laughter, and delicious aromas filled every session. Designed for youths with disabilities, this programme offers more than cooking lessons. It empowers students to build independence, practise life skills, and experience the joy of creating something with their own hands.

Across the weeks, our trainers guided the youths through a beautifully curated menu of Asian and international favourites. Each dish was chosen not only for its flavour, but for the opportunity it offered to practise sequencing, measuring, basic cooking techniques, teamwork, and following routines.

One of the highlights was preparing biryani, where students learned to layer fragrant rice with spices, vegetables, and aromatics. The rhythmic steps of washing rice, mixing spices, and watching colours blend together helped them understand the flow of a multi-step dish while building patience and coordination.

Their creativity shone during the session on mango sticky rice, as they worked with fresh mangoes and warm glutinous rice, learning to plate the dessert with care and pride. The excitement was just as high when they crafted snowskin mooncakes, moulding soft pastel dough around lotus paste and discovering the joy of making a festive treat by hand.

The youths also enjoyed exploring local flavours through laksa, where they learned to assemble noodles, vegetables, and toppings before ladling rich broth over their bowls.

Throughout the programme, what stood out most was the enthusiasm and determination each youth brought to the kitchen. With every session, they became more independent, more curious, and more confident in their ability to complete tasks, try new foods, and work collaboratively.

As part of Me2's commitment to empowering persons with disabilities through practical, real life learning, our team recently brought clients from SUNDAC Chua Chu Kang on an educational outing to Watsons. This visit was a key component of our Personal Hygiene module, designed to help participants strengthen daily living skills, build independence, and grow confidence in navigating the community.

During the outing, clients practised identifying common hygiene products such as shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, and sanitary items. They learned how to recognise labels, and make simple purchasing decisions, skills that are essential for personal wellbeing and everyday functioning.

Our trainers also guided learners through social and community interactions: walking safely in the mall, understanding store etiquette, seeking assistance from staff, and handling items appropriately. These experiences help participants transfer what they learn in the classroom to real world environments, making their learning meaningful and relevant.

Beyond product recognition, the outing offered clients a safe space to practise money handling, including choosing items within a budget and counting change at the cashier. This not only builds financial literacy but also reinforces confidence when interacting with frontline staff, an important step toward functioning independently in public settings.

Seeing the products in a real store helped them better understand why hygiene matters and when to use each item. They were encouraged to ask questions, explore different options, and think about their own daily habits, making the learning deeply personal and practical.

The visit to Watsons was not just about buying hygiene products, it was about building dignity, nurturing independence, and showing participants that they can confidently care for themselves in the community. At Me2, we firmly believe that every learning journey should open doors, strengthen self esteem, and encourage individuals to take the next step forward with pride.

Expanding Horizons: Launching Chatter Bug & My First Portfolio in Thailand



Me2 Centre of Inclusive Arts is proud to expand our regional footprint with the launch of two of our signature programmes, Chatter Bug and My First Portfolio, at The Arts of English in Nakhon Sawan, Thailand. This marks an exciting milestone as we continue bringing creative, right-brain-driven education to learners across Asia.

At The Arts of English, children experience English through imagination, movement, and expression. The addition of Chatter Bug, our dynamic public speaking and communication programme, introduces students to the fundamentals of confidence-building: body language, vocal expression, storytelling, and social-emotional awareness. Through games, guided practice, and performance-based activities, children learn to speak boldly, listen actively, and present with clarity—skills that support them far beyond the classroom.

Alongside Chatter Bug, Me2 is also launching My First Portfolio, a foundational drama and filmmaking programme that empowers young learners to explore character, creativity, and performance. Students build a mini digital portfolio through segments such as picture description, line delivery, improvisation, and on-camera practice, nurturing both communication skills and artistic curiosity. Speak Up with Me2 x MDAS: Helping Youths Find the Voices They've Always Had

Designed for youths whose voices are often overshadowed, not by ability, but by the pace and assumptions of the world this programme creates a safe, empowering space for them to be heard.

Across four uplifting sessions, participants learned how to introduce themselves confidently, hold conversations, express preferences, and advocate for their needs. Through simple frameworks, gentle practice, and supportive group activities, many grew more willing to speak up, take turns, and share their thoughts independently.

We witnessed powerful moments: soft voices becoming steadier, shy participants contributing more freely, and young people realising that their perspectives carry weight. The heart of this programme is not perfect speech, but dignity, ownership, and belief in one's own voice.

A crowd favourite was the storytelling segment featuring I'm the Biggest Thing in the Ocean! The children transformed into sea creatures with simple prompts, floating like jellyfish, scuttling like crabs, and swishing like seaweed, strengthening their confidence, imagination, and expressive movement.

Next came squid headgear crafting, where each child created a colourful squid hat using pre-cut tentacles and googly eyes. With support from our facilitators, every child proudly wore their handmade masterpiece and came together for an adorable final dance, performing ocean-inspired actions and ending with a big "splash pose" that lit up the room.

This celebration was more than just a themed event. It was a space for children to express themselves freely, build confidence, and enjoy movement and creativity tailored to their abilities.

In Plain Sight: Unveiling Our First Public Art Installation at One Punggol



On a bright and meaningful afternoon at One Punggol, we gathered with partners, families, supporters, and members of the community to mark a milestone we will never forget. As part of our Carnival of Stories launch, we unveiled our first ever public art installation, "In Plain Sight", a vibrant mural co-created by artists with disabilities and now proudly displayed at Punggol Atrium. It was a moment that blended joy, pride, and purpose in equal measure, reminding all of us just how powerful visibility can be.

The unveiling was led by our CEO, Ren, together with Sugu, the Executive Director of SUN-DAC. Their presence symbolised not only organisational collaboration, but also a shared belief that the arts can uplift, empower, and shift perceptions. As the cloth was gently drawn back, it prompted spontaneous applause from the crowd gathered around it.

A Celebration of Stories Long Kept in the Margins

"In Plain Sight" was developed under our No Longer in the Background initiative, a movement dedicated to bringing artists with disabilities to the forefront of Singapore's arts landscape. Too often, these individuals create, live, and express in ways that go unseen or unacknowledged. This installation stands as a bold reversal of that narrative, insisting that their stories not only deserve space, but belong in the heart of our public spaces.

The mural's bright colours, layered imagery, and expressive markings invite passers-by to pause and truly look. What appears simple from afar reveals intricate details up close: overlapping strokes, personal symbols, shared motifs, and quiet histories embedded in every line. Much like the artists themselves, this piece asks the viewer to slow down and discover what is often overlooked.

Words that Echo Long After You Leave

Surrounding the mural are quotes written by the artists, each one capturing a piece of their inner world. These reflections share glimpses of honesty, resilience, longing, and pride. For many visitors, hearing these voices for the first time added an emotional layer to the installation that images alone could not provide. What began as an art piece quickly became a space for connection and understanding, a moment where the public could listen, not just look.

A Carnival of Stories: Our First-Ever Inclusive Celebration at One Punggol



On 18 October 2025, Me2 Centre of Inclusive Arts marked a historic milestone with A Carnival of Stories, our first-ever fully inclusive public event. Held at the vibrant One Punggol Atrium, the Carnival brought together children, youths, adults, seniors, caregivers, educators, partners, and community members for a day overflowing with creativity, connection, and the power of shared storytelling.

As the event kicked off with the unveiling of our permanent art installation, the atrium transformed into a living, breathing canvas of colour and movement. Families wandered between interactive zones. Performers warmed up at the stage wings. Artists with disabilities prepared their showcases with a blend of excitement and pride. There was a palpable sense of anticipation, something new, something meaningful, something long-awaited was about to unfold.

The heart of the Carnival was built around four thematic pillars, stories that are unheard, unseen, unspoken, and undoing. These themes guided everything from performances, booths to workshops, inviting all who attended to reflect on the kinds of stories often pushed to the background. For many of our participants, this was the first time they had been given the space, support, and visibility to express their truths publicly.

Visitors were treated to theatre pieces, spoken word performances, dance, music, visual art, and interactive storytelling. Some stories were bold and humorous. Others were tender and reflective. Many were deeply personal, touching on identity, resilience, loss, healing, hope, and the quiet courage it takes to be yourself in a world that doesn't always understand you.

What made each performance especially powerful was the authenticity of the individuals behind them. These were not polished, rehearsed-for-perfection performers. These were people, artists, children, youths, adults with disabilities, caregivers, speaking in their own ways, at their own pace, in their own voice. And the audience listened. Really listened.

Beyond the main stage, the Carnival offered an entire avenue of curated booths and hands-on experiences. For many artists and participants with disabilities, this was their first time engaging with members of the public in such an open and celebrated platform.

UDO Singapore officially adopted our storytelling pillars into their Metamorph division



Following the momentum of our Carnival of Stories, the celebration continued in a powerful new way as AAG (Advisors Alliance Group) presented the Metamorph category at UDO Singapore's first official debut in Singapore and officially adopted Me2's Carnival of Stories' pillars as the foundation for their division. This partnership marked a meaningful extension of our work, bringing the spirit of Me2 onto a competitive dance stage where movement becomes a vehicle for truth, courage, and lived experience.

UDO (United Dance Organisation), one of the world's leading street-dance bodies, made its first-ever official appearance in Singapore this year, creating the perfect platform for Metamorph's "Dance for Change" showcase.

Before the Metamorph segment began, we paused to honour the quiet heroes who make every milestone possible: our caregivers. Three of Me2's caregivers were invited onstage for a deeply moving tribute. Deputy Prime Minister Gan Kim Yong presented each caregiver with a gift voucher, followed by an unforgettable moment when their children stepped forward with bouquets and a warm embrace. It was tender, emotional, and profoundly symbolic, a reminder of the love, strength, and unseen labour that sustain every journey. This tribute set the perfect tone for the afternoon ahead, paving the way for an extraordinary showcase of honest, powerful storytelling through dance.

With hearts full from the tribute, the atmosphere shifted as the Metamorph segment began. One by one, seven dynamic teams took the stage, each interpreting one of Me2's storytelling pillars, "The Unheard, The Unseen, The Unspoken, and The Undoing" through choreography that was bold, evocative, and deeply intentional.

The judges and audience witnessed pieces that moved beyond technical mastery. Some were raw and emotional; others were sharp, conceptual, and daring. Each performance carried its own heartbeat, its own truth, and its own way of wrestling with the pillar it embodied. By the end of the showcase, four teams were honoured with the prestigious Me2 Awards, recognising how meaningfully they captured the spirit and depth behind their chosen pillar.

As part of our Improv with Me2 programme, our participants recently took their learning beyond the classroom and into the real world with a meaningful trip to IKEA. This outing was designed as a continuation of our Personal Hygiene (Space) module, an important component that teaches participants how to maintain cleanliness, care for shared environments, and understand the importance of personal and communal hygiene in everyday life.

Before the journey, our trainers prepared the participants through classroom reenactments, visual guides, and hands-on routines that introduced essential concepts: respecting common spaces, keeping personal belongings organised, throwing waste responsibly, and practising good hygiene in public areas. The learning journey to IKEA served as the perfect real-world extension of these skills, offering a safe, structured environment for participants to apply what they had learned.

The moment we entered IKEA, the excitement was unmistakable. Participants explored mock living rooms, kitchens, bedrooms, and bathrooms, each setup offering a natural opportunity to discuss what it means to keep a space tidy, clean, and functional.

One of the highlights was observing how confidently participants applied their new knowledge. Many pointed out items that belonged "in the bathroom space" or "help keep things clean," and some even initiated conversations about what they use at home. The visit also allowed them to practise social behaviours, waiting their turn, moving safely in crowds, communicating needs, and using public amenities independently.

The outing ended with a small reflection circle, where the participants shared what they enjoyed most. Many spoke about the rooms they explored, the everyday items they recognised, and how proud they felt applying their hygiene skills in a real setting.

We look forward to more journeys like this, where every space becomes a classroom, every moment becomes an opportunity, and every participant shines a little brighter.

Every step, every beat, and every routine is a pathway to real-world performance opportunities that allow our dancers to shine in spaces they never imagined they could.

Dance with Me2 keeps movements simple, accessible, and deeply supportive. We break down steps slowly, use clear visual cues, and create a structured routine that participants can build on week by week. What makes Drama with Me2 truly special is the way participants slowly open up across the weeks. Those who are shy begin volunteering for scenes. Participants who usually give one-word answers start adding more detail to their lines. And individuals who may struggle with social engagement begin to connect more confidently with peers through shared stories and collaborative play.

The programme also prepares participants for real performance opportunities. As they grow more familiar with scripts, blocking, and stage presence, they build readiness to take part in showcases, community events, and presentation moments where their families and peers can witness how far they have come. For many, stepping into a role on stage becomes a breakthrough, an empowering moment that affirms their courage, creativity, and growth.

Grace Orchard School's "Tree of Life" Art Installation Programme



Following last semester's successful completion of a full-length wall mural, Me2 Centre of Inclusive Arts returned to Grace Orchard School with a bold new challenge for the students: creating their first three-dimensional art installation. This semester's project, titled "Tree of Life," invited students to step beyond brushes and paint, and into the world of structure, texture, and immersive art making.

What emerged over weeks of dedication, teamwork, and joyful experimentation was an installation that now stands proudly as a symbol of growth, courage, and community.

About Grace Orchard School

Grace Orchard School is a specialised learning environment dedicated to supporting students with mild intellectual disabilities and mild autism through a holistic, values-driven approach. The school emphasises character development, life skills, and vocational readiness, creating meaningful opportunities for students to learn, grow, and contribute confidently to their communities.

With a strong focus on partnership and experiential learning, Grace Orchard School provides a nurturing space where every student is encouraged to develop independence, discover their strengths, and thrive in both academic and real world settings.

The previous semester's mural project taught students how to work collaboratively on a shared canvas. They explored colour theory, basic painting techniques, and the discipline required to complete a large-scale artwork. That experience laid the foundation for this semester's creative leap from two dimensions to three.

The installation was designed as a layered piece combining painted elements, sculptural textures, and individual student contributions. The backdrop features a vibrant burst of multi-coloured leaves, each one uniquely crafted by a student.

The three-dimensional trunk, built with textured and recycled materials, was assembled piece by piece as students experimented with craft techniques such as folding, layering, gluing, and shaping. This tactile process made the project especially meaningful for students who learn best through hands-on engagement.

Grace Orchard School's "Tree of Life" Art Installation Programme

While the Tree of Life is a beautiful visual centrepiece, the true magic lies in the learning that happened along the way. Students grew in confidence as they took on new and challenging tasks, experiencing pride when their work was displayed. The project also strengthened teamwork and collaboration as they communicated, took turns, and worked toward a shared goal. Through handling varied textures and tools, they developed motor and sensory skills, exploring tactile materials in meaningful ways. Each leaf became an act of creative expression, reflecting students' feelings, colours, and individuality. Most importantly, they followed a real artistic process from conceptualisation to execution, gaining an authentic experience similar to that of professional artists.

Today, the Tree of Life installation stands as a vibrant backdrop in Grace Orchard School, enriching the environment with energy and meaning. Teachers pause to admire the details. Students proudly point out their contributions. The space has transformed into an uplifting visual reminder of growth, both artistic and personal.

This installation does not just decorate a wall. It tells a story of effort, teamwork, and the belief that every student has a place, a voice, and a contribution worth celebrating.

The success of the wall mural and the Tree of Life installation continues to affirm the value of integrating the arts into learning for students with diverse needs. Me2 remains committed to creating spaces where creativity thrives, skills are developed, and every individual shines.

One of the greatest joys in our work at Me2 is witnessing the real-world impact of the skills our students practise during training. This year, our Improv with Me2, Public Transportation Module (Bus) has brought us some of the most heartwarming moments yet. After weeks of learning how to identify bus numbers, read signboards, recognise landmarks, press the bell at the correct stop, and navigate routes safely in small groups, our students are now attempting actual travel journeys with their peers and the pride we feel is indescribable.

What begins in the classroom as structured role-play and guided practice slowly transforms into confidence during real outings. Students rehearse common scenarios: how to board safely, how to check their route on signages, and how to communicate with a friend or a bus captain when unsure. Gradually, these rehearsed steps become instinctive actions. The moment they take the initiative to recognise their stop or guide a friend, we know the learning has taken root.

Seeing them journey independently in small, supportive groups is a milestone that goes beyond transportation, it is a step into autonomy, responsibility, and belief in their own abilities. Their smiles, excitement, and sense of achievement remind us why inclusive arts and experiential learning matter so deeply. Each successful bus trip, no matter how short, is a victory for the students, their families, and everyone who has worked alongside them.

We could not be prouder of how far they have come. Every attempt, every decision, and every safe arrival tells a story of growth. And we look forward to celebrating many more journeys with them on the bus, in the community, and in life.

Finding Freedom in Movement: Move with Me2 at Enabling Services Hub@Jurong



At Enabling Services Hub@Jurong by TOUCH Community Services, movement becomes a language of confidence, joy, and self-expression through the Move with Me2 programme. Designed specifically for persons with disabilities, this programme brings participants into a safe, encouraging space where they can explore dance, coordinated movement, and physical expression at their own pace.

Each session focuses on helping participants connect with their bodies, build awareness of space, and experience the emotional release that comes from simply moving.

Move with Me2

Move with Me2 is an energising movement and expression programme designed to help participants build confidence, coordination, and body awareness through simple guided exercises, creative movement, and joyful group activities.

Each session encourages learners to connect with their bodies, explore rhythm and balance, and experience the emotional benefits of moving in a safe, supportive space. Perfect for centres seeking a meaningful blend of physical activity, social engagement, and expressive arts.

The energy in the room is always vibrant. Participants warm up together, mirroring simple sequences that encourage balance, coordination, and rhythm. Guided by Me2's movement trainers, they learn to shift weight, respond to music, and express emotions through gestures and poses.

Beyond individual movement, the programme deliberately includes partner and group activities that build social engagement and relational trust. In one exercise, participants practice balance together or pass items rhythmically, requiring communication, eye contact, and patience.

These interactive tasks help learners develop teamwork skills while also strengthening emotional regulation and focus. For many participants, these moments become powerful breakthroughs where they discover that they can connect, participate, and succeed.

Building Real-World Independence at Enabling Services Hub@Jurong



In addition to Move with Me2, we also run our Improv with Me2 programme at the Enabling Services Hub@Jurong by TOUCH Community Services. Through this practical life skills series, Me2 continues to empower persons with disabilities needs by equipping them with everyday competencies they can use with confidence. This semester, participants learned an essential self-care skill in the module Applying Plaster, a hands-on, confidence-building session that breaks down a simple routine into clear, manageable steps. Using guided improvisation and real-life practice, the module strengthens independence, problem-solving skills, and readiness for daily situations. Participants enjoyed the sense of accomplishment that came from mastering a real-world skill.

Participants began by exploring when and why we use plasters, learning to identify minor cuts or abrasions and understanding how proper care prevents infection.

Using visual cues, role-play scenarios, and easy-to-follow demonstrations, trainers guided participants through each stage, from selecting the right plaster size, peeling the backing, and applying it firmly onto the skin. The improvisational element allowed participants to practise in realistic scenarios, such as "I cut my finger while opening a box" or "I got a small scrape while walking," making the learning relatable and memorable.

By the end of the module, participants walked away with more than just a new ability. They experienced the empowerment that comes from knowing they can care for themselves in everyday situations.

Over the past months, our Me2 arts team has been working closely with SUNDAC clients to transform the centre's walls into vibrant visual stories that reflect joy, identity, and shared experiences.

The programme is built on a simple yet powerful belief: that art is for everyone. Each session invites clients to explore painting in accessible, enjoyable ways.

The mural itself reflects themes of community, hobbies, movement, and self-expression. Bright icons, rainbows, shapes, and creative motifs fill the walls, capturing the individuality of SUNDAC's clients while also representing the vibrancy of the centre. As each colour was added and each section completed, pride grew not only in the artwork, but in the process. Clients practised fine motor skills, decision-making, communication, teamwork, and sustained attention, all while experiencing the joy and calm that painting naturally brings.

For many participants, painting became more than an art task, it became a social activity that strengthened confidence and connection. The sense of ownership was clear. Each stroke, each symbol, each completed panel told the world, "I made this. I am part of this space."

Paint with Me2 continues to demonstrate the power of inclusive arts to uplift, engage, and inspire.


